In this brochure, you are invited to learn more about your Community Foundation's Centennial Society and how you can leave a lasting legacy for Weld County.

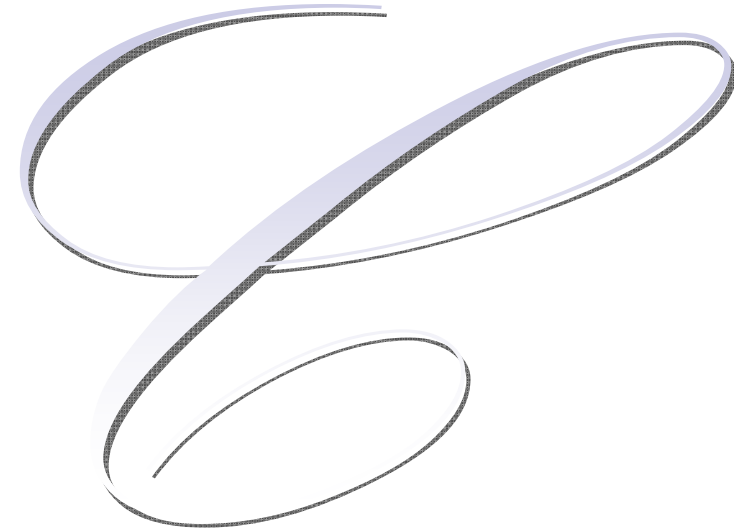

What is the Centennial Society?

The Community Foundation Serving Greeley and Weld County serves donors, non-profits and the communities of Weld County by building permanent endowments and making charitable grants.

The Community Foundation was established in 1995 to steward gifts to the community. Since then, individuals have continued to provide for this community's future through gifts from their wills and estate plans. We have been excited to learn about some of these gifts. They come in many forms – bequests, trusts, insurance policies and more. Some gifts are designated for endowment funds that benefit particular non-profits; other Centennial gifts support the changing needs of Weld County as a whole.


The Centennial Society was inaugurated in 2006 by the Community Foundation's Board of Directors. It is a means to recognize and thank those people who share the Foundation's vision of building permanent charitable capital, and who have affirmed that vision by making a planned gift to the Community Foundation.


Those willing to share their estate plans with the Foundation are honored through membership in the Centennial Society. Society members will be invited to attend thank you events for donors, and will be recognized in published rosters of the members, thereby serving to encourage others to consider planned gifts. (Members may also remain anonymous if they so desire.)


If you are in the process of making or revising your estate plan, we hope that you will consider making a gift for this community's future through the Community Foundation. We hope you will let us know of your gift if and when you make it.

How to Become a Member

The steps to take to become a member of the Centennial Society are as follows:

 Make a planned or deferred gift in any amount to the Community Foundation. There are many possible methods for making a gift, either during your lifetime or through your estate. (Your legal or financial advisor can help you evaluate the best options for you.)

 Provide the Community Foundation with a copy of that portion of your estate planning document pertaining to the gift.

 Sign a Statement of Gift Intention form for the Centennial Society.
